## Three honored at Hall of Fame dinner

In the 16 years since the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame was resurrected, the institution has added many illustrious personalities, including several from Canada.

On Thursday night, the Hall of Fame added another Canadian member – Eric Kokish – plus Russ Arnold, a world champion who has kept a relatively low profile in recent years.

At the same ceremony, Betty Ann Kennedy was honored as the 2011 recipient of the Sidney H. Lazard Jr. Award for Sportsmanship.

Arnold did not attend the dinner because of health issues, but Kokish and Kennedy were there and received enthusiastic applause for their many contributions to bridge over several decades. George Jacobs did the honors as master of ceremonies.

Kokish is known nowadays mainly for his success as a coach – most notably of the Nick Nickell team – but he has also excelled as a player, bidding theorist and writer.

Sami Kehela, another Canadian who is a member of the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame, told the

crowd at the dinner that he feels largely responsible for Kokish's choice of careers.

Not long after Kokish earned a law degree, Kehela related, he asked for advice about possibly starting a career in bridge. Kehela strongly advised against such a move – and Kokish went right out and did it anyway.

“He is dedicated and conscientious,” said Kehela, “although a trifle dogmatic.”

Kehela recalled that in 1980, as the Canadian team was preparing to head for the world championships in Valkenburg, Netherlands, he told Kokish not to offer unsolicited advice to Eric Murray, one of Canada's all-time great players, also now a member of the ACBL Hall of Fame. Kokish was a member of the team.

For one thing, Kehela said, Murray “has been playing since before you were born,” and for another, telling him how to play “could be hazardous to your health.”

Sure enough, said Kehela, Murray was involved in an auction involving a takeout double (by him) that didn't work out for the best. In the

### Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

## Welcome to Toronto

To all newcomer and intermediate players, welcome to Toronto. We know you will love the excitement, the fun and the frenzy of all the bridge events coming your way over the next 10 days. Take a moment to take a tour of the city or take in some theatre. Enjoy our great restaurants. We are proud of our home town and really want you to get a taste of it.



Here are some of the treats you are in for over the next few days and a few suggestions to make your experience that much better:

There are guest celebrity speakers twice a day – at 9:15 a.m. and 6:30 p.m., and they are free. You won't want to miss any of these. The pointers you will pick up will be invaluable. By this time next year, you will be ready to represent your country! Note that there are also three two-hour seminars: Saturday (Audrey Grant), Sunday (Jerry Helms) and Monday (yours truly). The seminars run from 10 a.m. to noon. After these three seminars, there are free games for newcomers. How good is that!

To become a Life Master, you need either 300 or 500 masterpoints, depending on when you joined ACBL. The points you earn at the club are black. You also need in your total 25 red points, 50 silver points and 25 gold points. The points you will earn at this tournament will be red and in some cases gold. From Monday to Friday, there are special games for intermediates where you can win gold points. Run, don't walk, to the Gold Rush Pairs.

The chief tournament directors in the Intermediate/Newcomer games (IN) are Judy Cotterman and Priscilla Smith. Judy, Priscilla and their wonderful team of directors will be happy to give you any information at any time. If you win, be sure to see them to have your photo taken! There is a partnership desk where you can pick up a partner of like ability. Be sure to come early if you need a partner, and if you find one on your own, be sure to tell the partnership desk.

The Daily Bulletin is a must-read. Read

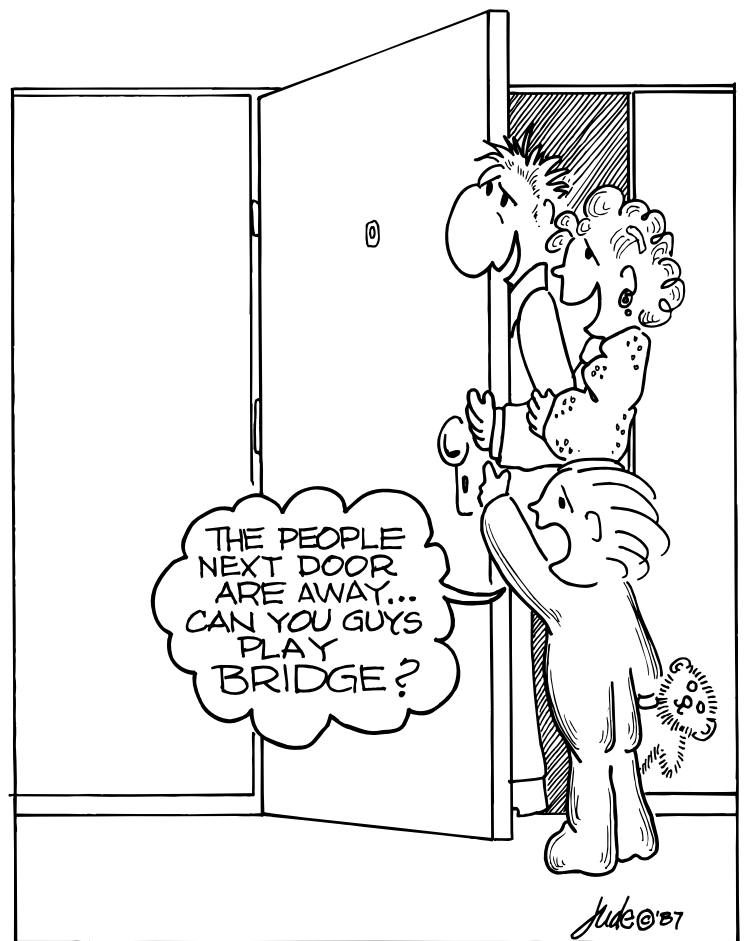
this cover to cover. It is packed with interesting articles and tells you where to go and what to do every day. Your name will also appear there in lights when you have won masterpoints! There is often entertainment or special goodies after the evening game ... watch for these notices in this publication.

Remember that this is a game of mistakes and you, like all of us, will be making plenty. Every time you make a mistake and you recognize it, chances are you won't repeat the blunder. You may start to believe that you are suddenly playing worse than before, but that's not true. At first, you were unaware of your errors. Now you are much more aware of them so you think you are making more. Don't despair – it just means that learning has occurred! Persevere! You will never stop learning in this great game, that's why you can never get bored with it.

Great chemistry takes place with a good partnership. Discover the joys of defense and the elation of bidding to a good slam. You can dine out on those for a month! If you are nervous, hold your head up high and fake self-confidence. Remember that whenever you become declarer, your brain turns to mush. The adrenaline is flowing and you won't perform at maximum efficiency. This is a temporary and curable condition. Experience cures this. Don't drink caffeine at night or those hands will be whirling through your head while you try to sleep!

Introduce yourself to your new opponents on each round. If they don't reciprocate, forgive them, they know not what they do. They are still on the last board, wondering why their partner failed to draw trumps or perhaps kicking themselves for going down. Focus is really important. Congratulate your opponents when they do well and while you must not gloat yourself, a quiet "Well done, partner" is always a good thing to say. Keeping partner happy makes for better bridge from your partner too. Say "well done" even if she should have made three overtricks, and she will play better on the next board.

Fill out a convention card and carry it with you. This tells your opponents what style of



bridge you are playing. Besides which, they will be so impressed that you have a card filled in that they'll be nervous and that's always good for your side!

Join the ACBL if you haven't already. It's the best deal in town. They record your masterpoints for you and send you a monthly magazine (the Bridge Bulletin) that is a superb read. There's even a reduced price for first-time members.

Pick up a hand record at the end of every session. It is loaded with information about the hands you just played. Keep a private score so that you can make the most of this fabulous learning tool. There is always someone around who will be happy to answer your questions about a deal or about life. Just ask.

Most important, have a wonderful time and remember that bridge may be just a game, but it's an exhilarating one. There will be tops and bottoms for all of us but the thrill of it all makes you keep coming back for more. It's the most popular card game in the world. Love it and it will love you right back. Thanks for being here!

## Thinking Bridge

What can go wrong ?

Opening lead: ♠6.

Bidding commentary: Routine. Any other sequence would be scary.

**Defensive commentary:** If you are East and declarer plays low from dummy, win the ♠K and shift to the ♥Q while you still have the ♣A for a reentry.

**Play commentary:** As South, you are in a nice contract and appear to have at least nine tricks once you drive out the ♣A, perhaps more. Time to ask yourself the inevitable question: What can go wrong? Do you see anything?

A born pessimist would see that if the spade lead is ducked at trick one and East wins and shifts to a heart before the ♣A is driven out, this contract might be defeated. Can you do anything about it? Yes! Win the ♠A and drive out the ♣A before the ♥A is driven out. Count your tricks: you will have four clubs, three diamonds and two major-suit aces.

Why risk a vulnerable game contract for couple of overtricks? If you are playing matchpoints, it is a slam dunk to play low as two overtricks look very likely. The rule of 11 tells you that East has only one spade higher than the 6, so chances are that it is not the king. Besides, if you go down in this contract, you will have plenty of company as other declarers will be similarly tempted.

Flight B winners will have their names engraved on the Sheinwold Trophy while the names of Flight C winners will be engraved on the Mac Nab Trophy.



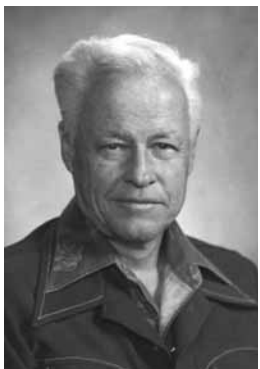
**Alfred Sheinwold**  
Alfred Sheinwold (1912-1997) was one of the greatest bridge writers in the history of the game. He was inducted into the Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

His syndicated bridge column was considered by many to be the best. He had a knack for getting his point across to even the least experienced players. He managed this by making sure that every column had only one main point, marking it easier for his readers to focus.

"You could read a Sheinwold column and know in an instant that nobody else could have written it," said Frank Stewart, co-author of the column. "He enlightened and entertained players through seven decades and earned millions of fans."

Sheinwold was an editor of *The Bridge World* from 1934 to 1963 and editor of *The Bridge Bulletin* from 1953 to 1958. He was also the author of perhaps the most successful bridge book ever written, *5 Weeks to Winning Bridge*, a book that sold in the millions.

Sheinwold served as chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission from 1964 to 1975, as chairman of the appeals committees at NABCs and as chairman of the ACBL Board of Governors from 1970 to 1973. He was named ACBL *Honorary Member of the Year* in 1983.



**Robin Mac Nab**  
Robin Mac Nab (1915-1985) served as a member of the ACBL Board of Directors from 1956 to 1981. He was ACBL president in 1965. He was a past president of the Western Conference, a member of the ACBL Laws Commission and a member of the

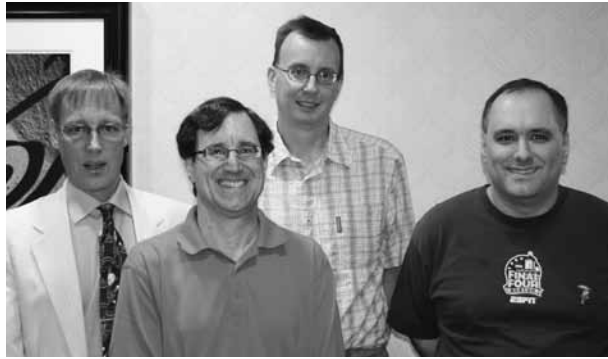
executive council of the World Bridge Federation.

Mac Nab, a graduate of Cornell University, was a member of the U.S. Olympic track and field squad in 1936.

## Mini-LM Pairs Begins Today

The **David Bruce LM-5000 Pairs** is open to players who have earned LM status and have won up to 5000 masterpoints.

The **Sally Young LM-1500 Pairs** is open to players who have earned LM status and have won up to 1500 masterpoints.

The events are named in honor of two of ACBL's all-time great players, both members of the ACBL Hall of Fame.

**David Bruce** (1900-1965) was one of the first 10 to be named Life Master; in fact, he was



#1. A tremendously successful player in the early Thirties, he was known as a soothing partner but an unsettling opponent. Bruce played with Oswald Jacoby and Howard Schenken on the first of the outstanding teams, the Four Horsemen, captained by P. Hal Sims.

In 1933 with Schenken, Jacoby and Dick Frey (joined shortly afterward by Michael Gottlieb), he organized the Four Aces. This team took the leadership in competition and held it for the next decade.

Unlike Bruce, **Sally Young** (1906-1970) was not one of the first 10 to be named Life Master.

She was, however, Life Master #17 and the first woman to earn the rank. Young earned success in open and women's events. She is the only woman to "three-peat" in the Reisinger. Young and teammates John Crawford, Charles Goren and Charles Solomon won in 1937 and 1938. They added B. Jay Becker to the squad in 1939 and won again.



Young also won the Reisinger in 1947 with teammates Jane Jaeger, Paula Ribner and Kay Rhodes. They remain the only all-women's team to win a major open team event.

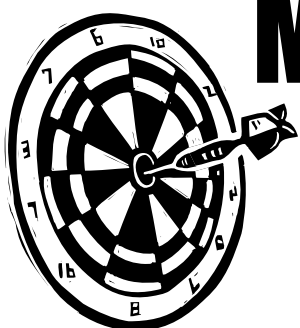

## Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

## Grand National Teams

The GNT is a North American contest with all 25 ACBL districts participating.

In 1985, the event was subdivided into three separate events: Flights A, B and C. Another change came in 2001 when the GNT Championship Flight (for players with more than 5000 masterpoints) was created. Flight A is now a 0-5000 event.

The winners of the Championship Flight will have their names engraved on the Morehead Trophy, donated by *The New York Times* in memory of its longtime bridge editor Albert H. Morehead. The winners of Flight A will have their names engraved on the Goldman Trophy, named in honor of the late Bobby Goldman.

### Albert H. Morehead

Morehead (1909-1996) was born in Flintstone GA and educated at Baylor and Harvard. Ely Culbertson hired him in 1932 because of his outstanding ability as a player and analyst and



made him technical editor of *The Bridge World* in 1933.

He proved so invaluable that in 1934 he was made general manager of all Culbertson enterprises. He was only 25 when he played on the Culbertson team that

defeated the British in the second international match for the Schwab Cup.

Morehead was the first bridge editor of *The New York Times* with a Sunday column from 1935 and a daily column from 1959. He resigned from the Times late in 1963 to devote full time to writing, editing and publishing of the dictionaries, encyclopedias and thesauruses that made him one of the foremost American lexicographers.

During those years, Morehead found time for tremendous service to organized bridge. He was an officer of the United States Bridge Association when that organization amalgamated with the American Bridge League in 1937.

He became a governor of the newly formed ACBL and served as president in 1943 and chairman of the board from 1943 to 1945. He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1946.

Morehead was a member of the National Laws Commission and was in charge of production of the International Laws of Contract Bridge. He was also the author of the constitution of the World Bridge Federation --- the first formal definition of the scope, structure, powers and duties of that organization.

Morehead was named to the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in 1996.

### Bobby Goldman

Bobby Goldman (1938-1999), who became a member of the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility, enjoyed a stellar career as a player, author and theorist. His tournament record is impressive. He earned four world titles (the Bermuda Bowl in 1970, 1971 and 1979 and the World Mixed Teams in 1972) and 19 North American championships: the Life Master Men's Pairs (1964); the Life Master Pairs (1968); the

(1968, 1989 and 1991); the Spingold Knockout Teams (1969, 1978, 1983, 1986 and 1988); the Reisinger B-A-M Teams (1970, 1976 and 1980); the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams (1971, 1973, 1978, 1997 and 1998). Goldman also had 13 second-place finishes in NABC events.



At the time of his induction into the Hall of Fame, Goldman was an ACBL Grand Life Master with more than 25,700 masterpoints, and ranked ninth on the all-time list of masterpoint holders.

He was also a WBF World Grand Master.

Goldman authored several books on the game, including *Aces Scientific* and *Winners and Losers* at the Bridge Table. His contributions to bidding theory include *Super Gerber*, *Kickback*, *Exclusion Blackwood* and *Goldman after Stayman*. He was one of the principal architects of the *Aces Scientific System*.

Goldman served as ACBL recorder from 1986-1988 and was a longtime member of the Competitions and Conventions Committee. His views on the game helped shape the modern-day Alert procedure, the ACBL convention chart, ethics and the appeals process.

Goldman was honored by the ACBL by being named the 1999 Honorary Member, presented for long and meritorious service to bridge.

Goldman's early career was distinguished by his association with the now-famous Aces, the professional, Texas-based team created by businessman Ira Corn for the purpose of winning world bridge championships. Goldman was a member of the successful squad until 1974.

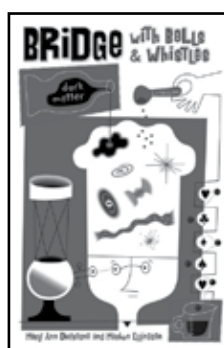

## Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

## Electronic Device Policy

The electronic device policy is revised as follows:

1. For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.

2. For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.

3. These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

4. A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

## Life Master Pairs begins today

### Life Master Pairs begins today

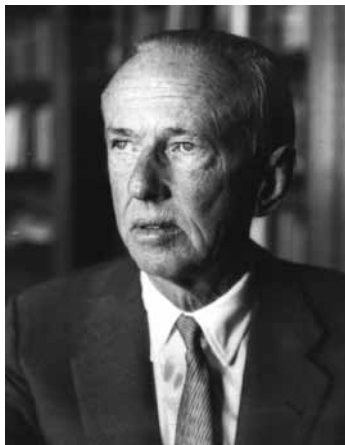
Top Norwegian players and world champions Boye Brogeland and Erik Saelensminde narrowly won the 2010 von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs. In the final session, the duo survived a poor result on a late play to maintain their lead over runners-up Norberto Bocchi and Guide Ferraro.

#### The play

The Life Master Pairs is a six-session event with two qualifying, two semi-final and two final sessions. It is restricted to Life Masters. At stake is the von Zedtwitz Gold Cup.

In 1930, Waldemar von Zedtwitz donated the Gold Cup, which was presented to the winners of the Life Master Pairs. The first winners: von Zedtwitz and P. Hal Sims.

**Waldemar von Zedtwitz** (1896-1984), ACBL president emeritus, was president of the ACBL in 1948 and of its parent organization, the American Bridge League, in 1932. He was named Honorary Member by the ABL in 1931.



When dissension threatened to break up the ACBL in 1948, the contesting factions agreed to von Zedtwitz as president and chairman with carte blanche power. He is credited with saving the ACBL. In 1949, upon the League's rehabilitation, he immediately returned his carte blanche power to the Board of Directors.

He helped found the World Bridge Federation and played a major role in the formation of the ACBL Charity Foundation.

As a player, von Zedtwitz was noted for his versatility in playing with exponents of different systems. He was one of the first 10 to be named Life Master (he was No. 4) when the category was created in 1936.

Von Zedtwitz won many national auction bridge championships and nearly all the contract bridge championships. He and Barbara Brier won the World Mixed Pairs in 1970 when von Zedtwitz was 74 and legally blind.

## Check Cashing and Bridge Bucks at the Toronto NABC



Entry fees are payable in U.S. or Canadian funds. Change will be given in the currency tendered whenever possible. Small change will be given in Canadian funds.

Canadian checks for the exact amount of entry and U.S. checks for the exact amount of entry will be accepted at the entry sale.

The check cashing desk will be at the Royal York on Friday, July 22, at noon. Additional locations and hours will be posted in the Daily Bulletin. Checks are only accepted during check cashing hours.

U.S. checks for amounts greater than entry (and less than the allowable daily limit) will be cashed for Canadian funds at the current exchange rate. Bridge Bucks will be sold for \$20 U.S. The current exchange rate will be used when purchasing Bridge Bucks with Canadian funds.

U.S. currency will not be exchanged for Canadian currency, neither at the check cashing desk nor at the entry sale.

## Slow play notice

If you are a habitually slow player, be aware that the ACBL Board of Directors unanimously approved this motion at the Fall NABC in 2010:

When a pair has fallen behind, it is incumbent on them to make up the time lost as quickly as possible whether at fault or not. All players are expected to make a concerted effort to catch up when they have fallen behind, regardless of the reason for their lateness.

In the absence of compelling evidence to the contrary, the director should presume that a pair finishing a round late by more than two or three minutes on more than one occasion during a session is responsible for the lateness. There is a strong expectation that the director will penalize such a pair. The size of a penalty will tend to increase for subsequent instances of slow play and for chronic or egregious slow play. While warnings typically will be given before a penalty is assessed, failure to do so in no way limits the director's authority to issue a penalty. An appeal of an action taken by a TD with regard to time may be taken to the Director in Charge of the tournament, and no further.

post-game discussion, Kokish had to ask Murray, “Are overcalls part of your repertoire?” Kehela said he just barely kept Kokish from bodily harm.

Kehela noted that Kokish’s success as a coach has obscured his expertise as a player – the highlights being two silver medals in international play. His work with the Nickell team, Kehela said, cemented his reputation as “the world’s preeminent coach.”

Nickell was next at the podium, and he praised his friend and coach: “Eric’s accomplishments and contributions to bridge are most impressive.”

In his acceptance remarks, Kokish thanked his many friends, teammates and partners – and especially his wife, Beverly.

He recalled that his first coaching gig was in 1985, when former WBF President Ernesto D’Orsi asked him to coach the Brazilian team to prepare for the world championships in Sao Paulo, Brazil. The team won the round-robin and made it to the semifinals before losing a close match to the United States.

Bridge, said Kokish, “is a great way to see the world, and there is nothing more gratifying than seeing players you worked with elevate their game and do well.”

Kokish noted that the Internet, especially Bridge Base Online, has made his job easier. He thanked Fred Gitelman, Sheri Winestock and Uday Ivatury – the brains behind BBO – “for making the world so much smaller.”

As for his coaching success, Kokish said, “I’ve learned much more from them than they have from me.”

Next up was Bobby Levin, presenter for Arnold.

Levin said that just before leaving for Toronto, he called Arnold and asked if there was anything he wanted to say at the Hall of Fame dinner. Arnold told Levin to tell the crowd, “Although I am not deserving of this award, I thank you very much.”

Levin said he was 15 years old when he first encountered Arnold. Levin was playing in a tournament in Florida and defended a contract in which he held the ♦A Q (plus some low ones) over dummy’s ♦K J 10 (also with some low ones). At one point, declarer played his singleton diamond to dummy’s jack, taken by Levin with the queen. The ace was later ruffed out and declarer made his contract. In the comparison, he found that Arnold, who held the same hand that Levin did at the other table, had defeated the contract by taking the ♦J with the ace, deceiving declarer and luring him into two down.

Levin was impressed. “Some day,” he said, “I’ve got to play with this guy.”

The two became friends and partners, and at one point, Levin and Arnold traveled to tournaments for five straight years. “I learned that he started bridge at age five, that he was trained as an accountant, that he played in his first (NABC) in 1955 in Chicago and that in the early Sixties he became a partner in an appliance company.”

As a bridge partner, Levin said, “he was steady, disciplined and always impeccable. He is the best declarer I have ever seen.”

Arnold and Levin were members of the winning squad in the 1980 Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, also winning the trials to play in the world championships. The following year, they won the Bermuda Bowl.

Arnold, Levin said, “has been a best friend to me for almost 40 years.”

Levin concluded, “Russ, if you were here tonight I would tell you how proud I am of you and how deserving you are – and I would have to tell you, I love you, man.”

Zia Mahmood did the honors for Kennedy. As a member of the selection committee for the sportsmanship award, Zia said this year’s selection “was the easiest we have ever had.”

Kennedy, elected to the Bridge Hall of Fame in 2005, had a 26-year partnership with Carol Sanders, who sent her congratulations via an email read by Zia.

Wrote Sanders, “What a beautiful honor for my dear friend Betty Ann to receive the Sidney Lazard Jr. Sportsmanship Award. Her entire career has exemplified good sportsmanship. Besides, we both knew and loved Sidney Jr. from the day he was born, which adds to the appropriateness and the thrill of the ceremony this evening.

“Betty’s kindness to her partners and opponents was always apparent and appreciated. We, as a partnership, never had a cross word, nor did I ever see her have one with anyone else. You are honoring a special person tonight – one with over 50 years of bridge competition and a like number of years exuding sportsmanship.”

Kennedy related that her bridge career was the result of an illness – encephalitis – she suffered at age 22. The brain problem left her unable to concentrate, and her doctor suggested taking up bridge as a way of regaining the ability to focus.

She resisted at first, but eventually took up the game and found that she had some talent. Kennedy recalled attending a tournament in New Orleans and being asked to fill in with another woman in the men’s pairs. All her opponents, she recalled, saw two women coming and were licking their chops, expecting a couple of tops. All that anticipation resulted in tops for Kennedy and her partner, and they won. “Now that,” she said, “was fun.”

Kennedy said she decided early on in her bridge career that she would always be kind to everyone at the bridge table, and she carries that same message to people she teaches. “I tell them to take ‘why’ and ‘why didn’t you’ out of their bridge vocabularies,” she said.

She said she was reared by gentle and loving parents who taught her the Golden Rule, “and it has always been primary with me.”

Harking back to the illness that resulted in her long love affair with bridge, Kennedy said, “What started out as the worst of times became the best of times.”
